# Abbott House Continues Expansion to Serve Children

Abbott House has been a beacon of light for children since 1939. We help many young people restore hope and begin to dream of a bright future. To do that we continue to be adaptive to the needs of the children we serve. In the early 2000's, we realized that children were coming into facility care and staying for too long — sometimes up to 6 years at that time. Why? Because they had no other place to go and no one that would take them. In response we created the Bridges program.

Bridges is a system of therapeutic foster homes that Abbott House owns in both Mitchell and Rapid City. We hire a married couple and then we provide the home, vehicles, food and everything the family needs. In addition, we arrange for therapy services for the children. Up to 6 children live in each home and they experience the same things my children did -- a loving home, public school, sports, family vacations etc.

These homes provide a safe, loving environment, where children can continue to heal from past experiences and have the opportunity to chart a new path.

I'm very excited to announce Abbott House has embarked on another expansion to the Bridges program. We are currently working to raise funds to open two new homes in Sioux Falls, SD. Soon we will have room for 12 more children in need. ## Sensory Room Provides Therapy for Our Youth

Abbott House has been under some major changes this year in our residential facility in Mitchell, SD. We have spent months renovating two classrooms and our sensory room. While we have kept this project under wraps for a while now, we are excited to reveal the finished rooms to the public!





All of our responses to life experiences are managed by how our brain processes the information. Every child in our psychiatric residential treatment program is given a "sensory-diet", which is a set of activities that will help them develop appropriate responses to life experiences.

For years, we have been assessing our children to better understand what they need to assist them from a sensory perspective. Many children benefited from our sensory room, which included several different sensory toys, weighted balls, scented lotions, bean bag chairs, and a swing. Now, with the help of a generous donor, our sensory room is bigger and better! After being moved to a larger room and undergoing some construction, the sensory room now also includes a rock-climbing wall, a punching bag, a whiteboard table, dimmable lighting, and so much more!

We also remodeled two classrooms. Each classroom serves roughly 15 students every single day. While the classrooms we spent years teaching in were well loved and carried memories of the Eugene Field School, the elementary school that occupied this building before us, we realized it was time to upgrade our rooms to better accommodate the children using them. The new classrooms feature new flooring, new cabinets, cubby storage space, different seating options to meet the needs of every girl, new individual technology options and dimmable lights!

Every small idea put into this project has come together to create a new, sensory-safe environment for our children. We are so proud of the end results of this project! 
## Abbott House Plans to Expand Bridges Foster Home Program

The number of children who need foster care in South Dakota continues to increase. In 2021 there were 1,647 children in foster care. Today there are more than 200 children waiting for a foster care family. In the last five years, that number fluctuated slightly but overall foster care needs are as high now as they have ever been.

Since 2013 Abbott House has opened eight therapeutic foster homes across the state – four in Mitchell and four in Rapid City. Each home provides a family for up to six youth who do not have a home. Currently, there are two boys and two girls homes in Rapid City and three girls and one boys home in Mitchell.

The South Dakota Department of Social Services is, again, asking Abbott House to step up and create two more therapeutic foster homes in the Sioux Falls area. That is why the Abbott House Board of Directors has authorized a \$2 million initiative to purchase and remodel two current homes for six boys and six girls up to age 18. The initiative has already been gifted more than \$620,000 from private donors to get the project started.
